It is also important to mention that compulsory elective courses can be offered to larger groups, while free elective courses typically start with smaller numbers of students and often require prerequisites. Therefore, in order to gain the necessary credits in time, we strongly encourage you to **begin registering for these courses even in your first academic year**.
