PUBLIC HEALTH AND PREVENTIVE MEDICINE

Nursing and Patient Care basic training
1st year nurse and physiotherapist students

1. Public health and preventive medicine is taught by 2 hours lecture per week. The participation at lectures is not compulsory, although it is strongly advised.
2. The education involves **online lectures and CooSpace BBB consultations**.
 - a. Lectures will be held **online as narrated PowerPoint presentation** at the appointed time by the timetable. The link of the narrated presentation will be available on the CooSpace, in the folder of the current lecture. At the time of the lecture students can ask questions related to the current lecture on the Forum, and the lecturer will answer them during or after the lecture. The PowerPoint presentation of the actual **lecture** will be uploaded to the “Educational materials” folder **in pdf form**, not later than the originally scheduled classroom lecture.
 - b. Three times during the semester there will be **CooSpace BBB consultations**, which provide an opportunity for real-time discussions related to the actual and previous lectures. The attendance of BBB consultations is not compulsory, but it is strongly advised. The Coospace BBB consultations will be held at the time of the lectures on the following days:

25 October 2021
29 November 2021
3. On the Coospace, a control-test containing 10 questions will belong to each lecture. Students must complete these tests by the end of the semester. A test can be fulfilled several times (up to 3 times), but at least once 60% performance has to be per each test.
4. The end-semester exam (first, second and third exam) will be organized as Coospace test. **The material that must be known for the examination is the textbook and the “Educational materials” (lecture slides, other documents) uploaded on the Coospace.**

There will be 50 single choice test questions (which were partly present in the control-tests) on the Coospace test, every correct answer is equal with 1 point. During 50 minutes, maximum 50 points can be gained. After answering a question, there is no opportunity to move back to a previous question. The result of the exam will be shown immediately after finishing the exam. Exam mark is calculated according to the following:

45–50 points:	excellent (5)
40–44 points:	good (4)
35–39 points:	accepted (3)
30–34 points:	passed (2)
0–29 points:	failed (1)
